Heights Fun Run

It's time for the 22nd annual Houston Heights 5K Fun Run on Saturday, June 2. Start time for the main race will be 7:30 AM. Walkers start at 7:35 AM, and the kids' 1K follows at 8:30 AM. The main course will start on Heights Blvd. at 18th Street heading south to 5th Street, then back north to Marmion Park, where the post-race party will begin. Plan to



celebrate with food, juice, and music while awards are announced and door prizes are given!

The entry fee for the 5K Run and Walk is \$20 until May 31, then \$25 on June 1 and 2. The fee for the kids' 1K is \$10, then \$15.

Overall Open, Master Male, and Master Female winners will each receive a \$50 Luke's Locker gift certificate. Awards go to the top three males and top three females in each age group.

Preparations Begin For Bicycle/Skate Rally

The Second Annual Heights Bicycle & Skate Rally will be held on Sunday, October 7, from 8:00 AM to 5:00 PM. Please save the date.

This year, there will be two courses. The shorter course will be 16 miles long, passing through River Oaks, West End, Timbergrove, and the Heights. The extended course will be 25 miles long, continuing through Oak Forest before returning to the Heights. As last year, the rally will start and end at the Fire Station.

There will again be a scavenger hunt in conjunction with the rally; participants can win prizes by using clues to find places and things along the route. All finishers will be eligible for prizes. There will be special awards for best costume and for oldest and youngest unassisted finishers.

This year's entry fee will be \$15.00 (pre-registration on line) and \$20.00 on the day of the event. All proceeds benefit the Heights Boulevard Beautification Fund.




Enjoy refreshments from Starbuck's at 610 & Nicholson. Participants will receive tree brochures, and information will be available for everyone.

All of the properties listed below are considered historic, meaning they are at least 51 years old. Demo Watch

Demolition activity has picked up again in Houston Heights. According to information supplied by the Code Enforcement Division of the City of Houston Public Works Department, there were 13 demolitions or relocations in Houston Heights between April 16 and May 21. This brings to 249 the number of demolitions in the last 23 months. Several of the properties we lost this time were considered important structures in the proposed Heights Historic Districts.

Establishing historic districts is the only legal way to deter demolition and relocation of our historic housing stock, the reason many of us choose to buy homes here. If you live within the boundaries of the proposed districts and have not yet signed the blue petition page, now is the time to do so. The longer it takes to gather signatures of support from the required 51 percent of the property owners within the proposed districts, the more houses we will lose.
