## Director Election Schedule

Seven of the fifteen positions on the HHA Board of Directors will be filled by election over the next few months. Five positions are opening due to normal expiration of terms; members elected to these five positions will have three-year terms. Two positions are for the remaining last year of terms ended by resignations.

The five nominees receiving the highest numbers of votes will fill the three-year terms; the nominees receiving the sixth and seventh-highest vote counts will fill the one-year vacancies. See the right column on page 2 for a list of current Directors.

The schedule for the election of Directors to serve terms starting in 2011 will be as follows, in accordance with the By-Laws and Policies of the Association:

- September 13, Nominations for Board of Directors will be held at the General Meeting. Nominators and nominees must be current members of the Association. Nominators may speak for two minutes, seconds for one. Please be sure before you nominate someone that your nominee will commit to serve. Nominees will not be allowed to speak on their own behalf during the September meeting.
- By September 15, the Election Committee will distribute to nominees election packets containing bylaws, policies, articles of incorporation, committee responsibility list, detailed election schedule, and a statement confirming that the nominee has read the

bylaws and policies and agrees to serve in accordance with them if elected.

- By September 18, signed statements from nominees are due, as well as a 50-word statement from each nominee for publication in the October newsletter.

- October 11, nominees or their representatives may speak on their qualifications at the General Meeting for 3 minutes. They will also draw for ballot positions.

- On or before October 15, the Election Committee will mail a ballot with a control number to each member whose dues are current as of October 1.

- By November 6 at the close of the post office, ballots returned by mail must be received with control numbers intact.

- November 8, polls will be open for secret balloting in person from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM before the General Meeting. The Election Committee will tabulate ballots and announce the results during the meeting. The results will also be published in the December newsletter.

## PUBLIC NOTIFICATION – Proposed HPO Changes

*[This notification by the City of Houston, Planning and Development Department was to be sent to owners of property in the current designated Historic Districts and those with applications currently under review. It had started arriving by the time we went to press. –Editor]*

As a property owner within one of Houston's proposed or designated Historic Districts, please be advised that the City of Houston is proposing amendments to the Historic Preservation Ordinance that are aimed at protecting historic properties within an historic district. Key provisions include the elimination of the 90-day waiver for historic properties when a Certificate of Appropriateness is denied by the Houston Archaeological and Historical Commission, revising the historic district designation process, and clarifying appropriate building materials.

Public meetings in the community will be held to receive comments on the proposed amendments. Information about these meetings and a draft of the proposed ordinance can be found online at [www.houstontx.gov/planning/HistoricPres/hist\\_pres.html](http://www.houstontx.gov/planning/HistoricPres/hist_pres.html). Any recommended changes will be considered by the Houston Archeological and Historical Commission, the Planning Commission, and City Council before adoption.

# Historic Preservation Ordinance Summary of Amendments

*A summary by the City of Houston Planning Department as of July 19*

The amendments are written largely to protect historic properties within our Historic Districts. Minor amendments are proposed for historic properties outside a district, i.e. landmarks and protected landmarks. The following is a summary of the proposed amendments. Public meetings and public hearings are planned for the end of July through September.

- Revised the Historic Designation process by eliminating the petition process. Instead a property owner or owners may initiate an application. The Planning Department will send cards to all property owners within a proposed district after holding a public meeting on the proposed district. In order for the application to move forward, 67% of the owners of tracts in the proposed district who return cards must indicate their support for the district. The boundaries may be modified to achieve the required support. Historic District designation may still be initiated by the Historic Commission.

- Further clarified the use of new materials for rehabilitation, restoration, addition of any landmark, protected landmark, or any building, structure object in an historic district, or any building, structure or object that is part of an archaeological site.

- New construction in an historic district must be compatible with the setback, exterior features, and proportions of contributing and potential contributing structures on the block face and facing block faces.

- Expanded the submittal requirements for certificates of appropriateness for the demolition of a historic structure and modified the criteria for demolitions proposed by nonprofit organizations.

- Eliminated the 90-day Waiver Certificate for contributing and potentially contributing structure within an historic district or for new construction in an historic district.

- The Old Sixth Ward Protected Historic District becomes an historic district, which will have the same protections it currently enjoys, thus rendering the separate treatment of the Old Sixth Ward Protected Historic District redundant.

## Change Happens! Mentoring Program

Change Happens! is a community-based, non-profit organization located in the Third Ward, founded in 1989 by the Rev. Leslie Smith. It began as an alcohol and drug prevention/intervention and outpatient treatment program, and has expanded to meet the needs of the entire family through a number of services.

The Youth Service department offers mentoring programs aimed at supporting families to empower their children and the community. A mentor is defined as a wise and trusted counselor, teacher, or positive role model. Through screenings and an interviewing process, they are able to provide a safe environment for the children they serve, qualified and dedicated volunteers, and uncompromised professionalism.

The mentoring programs offers a community-based program called MATCH, (Mentoring Activities to Children of Hope). This program is designed to reduce or prevent youth involvement in gangs, academic failure, and the onset of use of alcohol, tobacco, or other drugs, as well as other risky behaviors. The MATCH Program's target population is children in the greater Houston area that have one or more parents incarcerated. In this program, the mentor relationship is developed through one-to-one activities within the community. The MATCH program allows an opportunity for children to develop positive relationships, bonding, and strengthen protective factors.
