Bike Rally

The 5th Heights Bicycle Rally & Scavenger Hunt will be held on Sunday, October 3. Entrants will bicycle a 20-mile course through the Heights, Montrose, River Oaks, South Hampton, Mid Town, Downtown, and Sixth Ward. The entire route is on City of Houston bike trails. Each entrant will be issued a rally card, a rally map, and a scavenger hunt clue list. There is no rain date for this event. Rain or shine, the event goes on.

The rally route starts and ends at Marmion Park at 18th and Heights Blvd. Participants may start at any time after 7:30 AM. (This is not a race.) Children under 12 must wear required safety gear. Riders must obey all traffic laws.

To be eligible for prizes, an entrant must complete the rally by 4:00 PM and deposit the validated rally card in the prize entry box at Marmion Park. The rally card must be validated at the checkpoint, which is also the rest stop.

Each entrant will be provided a list of clues each of which describes a sight or an object that can be seen along the rally course. The person who finds the most mystery objects will be judged the winner. The clue list will have a place to write the address or nearby intersection where the mystery object is located. Scavenger hunt entries must be turned in by 4:00 PM.

Rally participants who have pre-registered may pick up their packets at Marmion Park on the day of the event. Participants may also register at Marmion Park on the day of the event. Registration then will be \$20 for an adult, \$10.00 for a child.

Historic Preservation Ordinance

Amendment Status

The final public comment draft of the proposed amendments to the City of Houston Historic Preservation Ordinance was released on September 15. The Development and Regulatory Affairs Committee of City Council reviewed the amendments on September 20. The Houston Planning Commission held its public hearing about the amendments on September 23.

If Planning Commission made its recommendations the following week as expected, the amendments could go to City Council as early as October 6. If the proposal is not changed materially from the second draft, there will be a short transition period following Council's adoption of the amendments, which may include a reconsideration of some districts.

Director Election Schedule

Seven of the fifteen positions on the HHA Board of Directors will be filled by election over the next few months. Five positions are opening due to normal expiration of terms; members elected to these five positions will have three-year terms. Two positions are for the remaining last year of terms ended by resignations.

The five nominees receiving the highest numbers of votes will fill the three-year terms; the nominees receiving the sixth and seventh-highest vote counts will fill the one-year vacancies. See our August issue for a list of current Directors.

The remaining portion of the schedule for the election of Directors to serve terms starting in 2011 will be as follows, in accordance with the By-Laws and Policies of the Association:

- October 11, nominees or their representatives may speak on their qualifications at the General Meeting for 3 minutes. They will also draw for ballot positions.
- On or before October 15, the Election Committee will mail a ballot with a control number to each member whose dues are current as of October 1.
- By November 6 at the close of the post office, ballots returned by mail must be received with control numbers intact.
- November 8, polls will be open for secret balloting in person from 6:00 PM to 7:00 PM *sharp* before the General Meeting. The Election Committee will tabulate ballots and announce the results during the meeting. The results will also be published in the December newsletter.

Update: Proposed Retail Development

The Houston Heights Association Board and the Greater Heights Super Neighborhood Council (GHSNC) continue to follow the proposal for a large retail development at Yale and Koehler Streets (south of I-10). Both bodies have adopted neutral positions on the development as a whole, focusing rather on mitigation of potential negative impacts on the neighborhood.

At its September 22 meeting, City Council approved a 380 Agreement with the developer.

Restoration Committee

The next Houston Heights Association Restoration/Historical Committee meeting will be held at 616 Harvard St. on Thursday, October 14, from 7:30 to 9:30 PM.

If you travel North on Harvard from White Oak in the first block, on your right you cannot miss the beautiful garden in front of a 1920's cottage home set back from the street. The "enchanted" exterior of this home and garden invite the curious to learn more about it.

This 1920s-era home was built by W.G. Steele, who had it built next to 618 Harvard, a home he gave his daughter. This house was most likely set back off the street because in the early days Harvard was a dirt-filled street with lots of mud when it rained. Since 1991, the present owner has transformed the front yard by designing and building a garden filled with many exotic and beautiful flowers and sitting areas. The garden is especially beautiful when everything is blooming, and it has been the site of 3 garden tours including the prestigious National Conservancy Gardens of America tour. This garden was one of only seven chosen in Houston and the only one not in River Oaks.

The home was on the Houston Heights Spring Home Tour in 2001. Inside this cozy 2-bedroom, 2-bath home with country kitchen and attractively furnished living area, one finds many special interest collections. Bunny rabbits, angels, and family memorabilia all unite to complete the warm, cozy cottage feeling. This is a must-see home.

Of special interest to meeting attendees will be what one woman has done almost single handedly from removing wall-to-wall carpet to stripping ceiling tiles, removing milk-based paint from ship-lap walls and ceiling and installing old cypress doors to using a pick-axe in the back yard to remove asphalt. All these experiences were accomplished in stages by a self-reliant, energetic woman who is a member of the Daughters of the Republic of Texas and is characterized by her "can do" attitude.

The Houston Heights Restoration/Historical Committee meetings are open to the public bimonthly to learn about history and restoration in keeping with an appreciation of the historic nature of the Houston Heights. Membership in the Houston Heights Association is encouraged but not mandatory to attend these events.
